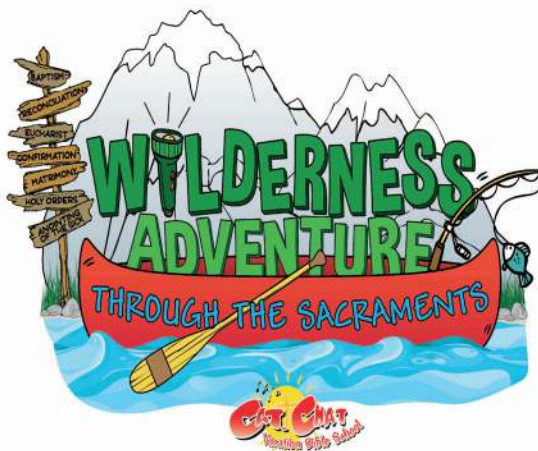

DID YOU KNOW.....

Did you know the Church says even though marriage is first sacrament instituted by God; other sacraments are needed before you get married?

In fact, the USCCB says, "Sacred Scripture begins with the creation and union of man and woman and ends with 'the wedding feast of the Lamb' (Rev 19:7, 9). Scripture often refers to marriage, its origin and purpose, the meaning God gave to it, and its renewal in the covenant made by Jesus with his Church. Man and woman were created for each other. By their marriage, the couple witnesses Christ's spousal love for the Church. One of the Nuptial Blessings in the liturgical celebration of marriage refers to this in saying, 'Father, you have made the union of man and wife so holy a mystery that it symbolizes the marriage of Christ and his Church.' The Sacrament of Marriage is a covenant, which is more than a contract. Covenant always expresses a relationship between persons. The marriage covenant refers to the relationship between the husband and wife, a permanent union of persons capable of knowing and loving each other and God. The celebration of marriage is also a liturgical act, appropriately held in a public liturgy at church. Catholics are urged to celebrate their marriage within the Eucharistic Liturgy. Getting married in the Catholic Church isn't just about picking a date and showing up. It's a meaningful process that focuses on preparing you spiritually and practically for a lifelong commitment. The good news? You don't have to figure it out on your own. Here's a bit of advice to get you pointed in the right direction. While confirmation is highly recommended prior to marriage, it is not absolutely necessary in all cases. A Catholic may marry even without having received First Communion; baptism alone is sufficient for the sacrament of marriage. As stated in the Catechism of the Catholic Church (Can. 1065 §1.)

"Catholics who have not yet received the sacrament of confirmation are to receive it before they are admitted to marriage if it can be done without grave inconvenience. §2. To receive the sacrament of marriage fruitfully, spouses are urged especially to approach the sacraments of penance and of the most Holy Eucharist." But what if one person isn't even Catholic? As long as one of you is baptized Catholic, the other person can be another Christian, or even not baptized at all, but that will require special permission from the Church. In addition, both of you must be free to marry. That means you're not currently married, or if one of you was married before, the Church will need to confirm whether an annulment or other process is required. You can't be closely related (like immediate family or first cousins). Both of you must freely choose marriage, without pressure. And of course, as the Church teaches, the union must be between a man and a woman. If you're unsure about any of this, don't stress, your parish can help you sort it out. Just make sure you contact your parish before booking a venue or setting firm plans. As most parishes ask for at least six months of preparation, and some require more. Reaching out early helps everything run more smoothly and avoids surprises later. Marriage prep isn't just a box to check. It's designed to help you build a strong foundation. Yes, there's some paperwork, but your parish will guide you through it. Think of this step as tying up loose ends so everything is official and stress free. Many couples say the process helps them feel more connected to each other and to their faith, setting the tone for a strong, lasting relationship. Getting married in the Catholic Church is more than just making grandma happy. It's about inviting Christ to be a part of your covenant, so no matter what difficulties come your way, you won't face them alone. In fact, God reminds us, "Where one alone may be overcome, two together can resist. A three-ply cord* is not easily broken. (Ecclesiastes 4:12)" If you're ready to begin your marriage prep, address your first invitation to Jesus by reaching out to your local parish. Your forever starts here. Stay tuned next week when we discuss the question: is it a sin to pray to Mother Mary?
