DID YOU KNOW.....

Did you know the Church says if Jesus came to us through Mary, we can go to Him through her as well?

Some Christians will ask, "Why pray to Mary when we can go directly to Jesus?" And yet they have no problem asking others here on earth to pray for them, instead of simply and solely praying to Jesus on their own. Indeed, St. Paul says that God grants blessings "in answer to many prayers" (2 Cor. 1:11). And if the prayer of a righteous man on earth avails much with God (Jas. 5:16-18), how much more would prayers from one who has finished the race and now reigns with Christ in heaven? I particularly like the way St. Louis De Montfort says that we should not ourselves be so holy that we can't go to Mary to approach Jesus, after all, He went to her to approach us. So, what are Catholics really doing when they "pray to Mary." Are they worshiping her? Are they putting her above Jesus? The short answer is no, not at all. But the long answer is actually beautiful, and it helps explain why Mary is so important for Catholics. Catholics love Mary because she's the Mother of Jesus and a powerful example of what it looks like to say "yes" to God. When Catholics "pray to Mary," they're not treating her like a goddess. They're asking for her help, the same way you might ask a trusted friend to pray for you. Think of it like this, as Catholics, we believe Mary prays for us, bringing our needs to her Son with a mother's love. I mean, who else would you rather have tap Jesus on the shoulder and bring your needs to His attention? Her life shows what humility, trust, and obedience to God looks like in real time; of all created beings, she is our greatest model of faith. Remember, even though Jesus was fully man, He is not a created being like you and me, He is God. And since she's the Mother of Jesus, Catholics see her as a mother to all who follow Him. In fact, when Jesus gives His mother to the disciple John at the foot of the cross, He is effectively making her the Mother of the Church and thus, the Mother of all the faithful. (John 19:25-27) Praying to Mary is really about drawing closer to Jesus through someone who knows Him better than anyone else. Think about it, when we say a Hail Mary or a Rosary, they're not just about Mary, they're meditations on the life of Christ. In other words, prayers to Mary never end with her, she is always pointing us to the love and mercy of her Son, Jesus. Many people simply talk to Mary in their hearts, asking for comfort, guidance, or help, but the source of that help is always rooted in God. Reflecting on Mary's virtues, her courage, her trust, her openness to God, can inspire us to live our own faith more deeply. Her whole life is a reminder of God's mercy and love, and she helps believers grow in their relationship with the Holy Trinity. The early Church Fathers and countless saints have seen Mary as a sign of God's tenderness. Her humility and grace continue to inspire Christians today. Catholics can, and do, pray to Mary as a way of asking for her intercession and learning from her example of faith. It's a tradition rooted in centuries of Christian devotion and a deep trust in God's mercy. So, don't worry about offending Jesus by praying to His mother; He follows the Ten Commandments the same as you and me. He honors His Father and Mother, and we honor Jesus by doing the same. If you find yourself struggling to find a deeper relationship with Jesus, asking for Mary's help is a perfect way to get pointed in the right direction. Stay tuned next week when we discuss what Jesus means when He says we should strive to be meek and humble.
