Dear Parents,

I write to you with sincere gratitude for your dedication to the faith formation of your children, and with great joy to share a providential moment of grace now before us. The State of Texas has established the Texas Education Freedom Accounts (TEFA), a historic opportunity that can support families currently enrolled or seeking a Catholic education rooted in faith, values, and academic excellence.

As parents, you are the first and most important educators of your children in the life of faith, whether they are formed through parish catechetical formation, Catholic schools, or both. Your commitment to their spiritual growth is a vital gift to the Church. The Texas Education Freedom Accounts (TEFA) offers new possibilities, providing eligible students with approximately \$10,474 annually for tuition, books, lunch, and other expenses. This blessing helps families sustain or gain access to Catholic schools as they discern the best path for their children's education.

In his recent Apostolic Letter on education, *Drawing New Maps of Hope*, Pope Leo XIV reminds us that Catholic education is never an individual effort, but a shared mission of the Church. He writes, "Christian education is a collective endeavor: no one educates alone. The educational community is a 'we' where teachers, students, families... converge to generate life." In this spirit, both our parish catechetical formation and our Catholic schools participate in the Church's mission to form young people in faith, wisdom, and love.

I encourage you to learn more about TEFA by visiting sacatholicschools.org and to register for email updates so you may be notified when the application period opens on February 4. I also invite you to share this opportunity with friends, neighbors, and extended family who may now be able to consider Catholic education. In this way, you become witnesses to the Church's hope for every child.

Thank you for your trust, your sacrifices, and your love for the Church. Be assured of my prayers for you and your family, as the Holy Spirit guides you in forming the next generation in faith.

DID YOU KNOW.....

Did you know the Church says the naked body is beautiful?

Now before you go and renew your subscription to Cine-max, please understand that the naked body is beautiful because God made it so. Everything He gives us is ordered towards our good, and thus, we should order everything we do to share that goodness with others. Sometimes we, like Adam and Eve, allow temptation to distort how God intended us to experience this goodness, leaving us with a disconnect from the truth. Adam and Eve did not realize they were naked until after the sin of disobedience was complete, when they both had eaten of the forbidden fruit. The first thing they notice is each other's sexuality; their nakedness could now be exploited for personal gratification; lust enters the world. Lust is the disordered desire for or inordinate enjoyment of sexual pleasure, sought for itself apart from its procreative and unitive purposes. Our sexuality is the most intimate treasure we have to offer; hence it is reserved as a gift exchange solely between man and wife for the procreation and building up of families that imitate the Holy Family. The biggest modern threat to the family is pornography. The Catechism of the Catholic Church defines pornography as the removing of real or simulated sexual acts from the intimacy of the partners, in order to display them deliberately to third parties. It offends against chastity because it perverts the conjugal act, the intimate giving of spouses to each other. It does grave injury to the dignity of its participants (actors, vendors, the public), since each one becomes an object of base pleasure and illicit profit for others. It immerses all who are involved in the illusion of a fantasy world. It is a grave offense. (CCC 2354). Modern culture often narrows the definition too much, focusing only on explicit websites, while the underlying issue is much larger. The heart of the matter is not just external content but internal disposition; do I treat others as objects rather than people deserving love and dignity? We should strive to move beyond merely avoiding problematic content and instead actively pursue holiness, love, and personal integrity. This includes not only moving away from pornographic videos, sex scenes in movies, and explicit pictures, but erotic literature as well. Pope St. John Paul II, in his book *Love and Responsibility*, said that "the person is a good towards which the only proper and adequate attitude toward a human person is love." People are never meant to be used; they are meant only to be loved. We're all created in God's image, and because of that, our dignity and the dignity of others really matters. Sometimes the world pulls us in directions that don't line up with that truth, and it's easy to lose sight of the bigger picture. At the heart of things, the question isn't "What can I get away with?" but rather "Does this help me grow in virtue and love?" When we start looking at others as objects instead of people who deserve real love and respect, we drift from what God wants for us. The goal is not just avoiding things that aren't good for us, but actively pursuing holiness, integrity, and a deeper love for God and others. If you ever want to talk more about how to strengthen that kind of life, your local parish is a great place to start. Stay tuned next week when we dive into the question, where did the Bible come from? God Bless, Deacon Frank
