DID YOU KNOW.....

Did you know the Church says that Catholics are the original Christians?

If you're like me, you grew up going to Mass every Sunday because our parents told us to. Others wandered into the Church later in life, sometimes after trying out other Christian communities. Many left the Church for a while, only to eventually find themselves pulled back. No matter the situation, there's a bigger question behind it all: why Catholicism? Here are a few things that make Catholicism feel like the real deal to me. Foremost, I think Jesus got it right! Jesus, whom we believe is also God, started the Catholic Church way back in the year 33A.D., when He handed over the keys of the Kingdom to St. Peter, the first Pope (Matthew 16:19). This isn't a denomination that was started by any regular man or woman, this is the Church started by the Son of God. The early Christians didn't even think in terms of denominations; they simply saw themselves as one Church united in Christ. And thus, the word "Catholic" which means "universal", was applied to the early Church. Secondly, the Eucharist! Catholicism teaches that Jesus meant what He said, the bread and wine actually become His Body and Blood (John 6:54) It's not a symbol; it's an encounter. And that's something you simply don't find anywhere other than the Church that Jesus Himself started. Honestly, once you start to understand that Jesus does not lie, and that He really is present in the Eucharist, everything else feels secondary. Another thing I love about Catholicism is how down to earth it is. We're not just floating spirits; we're human beings with senses, emotions, and physical needs. So, it makes sense that God would speak to us through things we can touch like water in baptism, and bread and wine in the Eucharist. Even things like the Sign of the Cross and rosaries are also reminders that God meets us in the real world. To help navigate this real world, God also gave the Church a teaching authority: the Magisterium. (CCC 84-87). This doesn't mean every Catholic makes perfect choices (far from it), but it does mean the Church has a consistent way of protecting core truths from getting watered down or reinterpreted every few years. While thousands of Christian denominations all claim to interpret Scripture correctly, I find comfort in having a spiritual GPS that follows the original map and doesn't constantly recalculate. I also find comfort knowing I can go to Mary, the Mother of God, and ask for directions. I mean, we ask our neighbors and friends for prayers, why not go to someone who knows Jesus intimately to do the same? Plus, honoring Jesus' mother is both natural and biblical (Luke 1:28-48). If God thought she was important enough to bring His Son into the world through her, you can be assured we can go to her to reach her Son. Lastly, I appreciate how much the Church understands our human nature. Catholicism gets that we mess up a lot, that we need forgiveness, we need community, and we need role models like the Saints. But most of all, the Church understands that we need the healing Grace that God freely offers through the Seven Sacraments. All of which can only be found in the Catholic Church. God loves us, and wants to meet us where we're at, but don't be afraid to go meet Him where He's at. If you're interested in joining the Church Jesus founded, your local parish can help. Stay tuned next week when we talk about what you should really give up for Lent.
