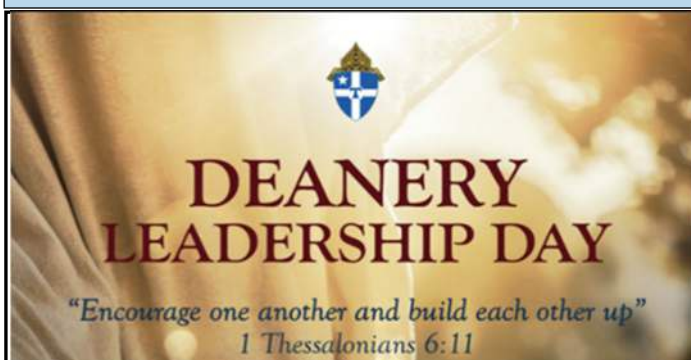

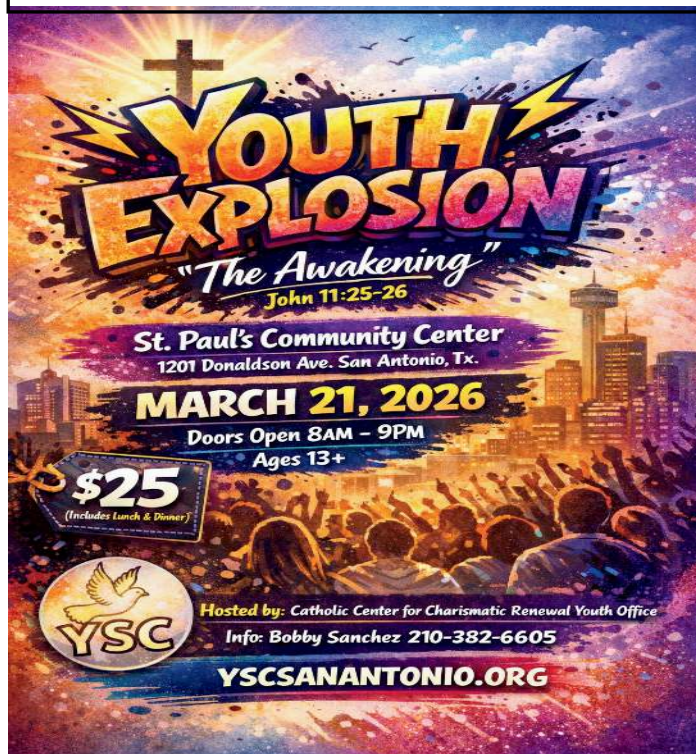

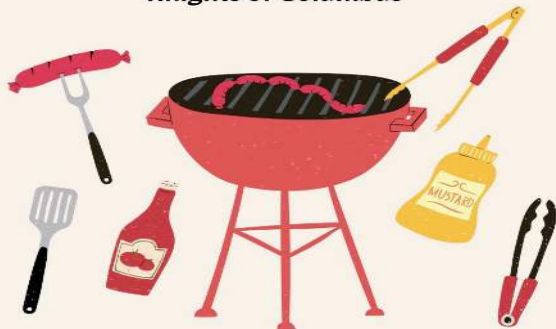

DID YOU KNOW.....

Did you know the Church says you should work even harder on Sunday's?

Well, work harder at serving the Lord and taking it easy that is. You've probably heard one of the Ten Commandments say, "Keep holy the Sabbath." But what does that really mean for us today? Does it mean working on Sunday's is a sin? In the Old Testament, God created the world in six days and rested on the seventh. That's why the Sabbath was considered sacred, a day of complete rest for the Jewish people. Now, Jesus was Jewish, so He observed the Sabbath too, but He also gave us a new covenant that totally changed this requirement, kind of. He reminded people that the Sabbath was meant to serve humanity, not burden us. That's why He said, "The Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath." He even healed people on the Sabbath, which upset the religious leaders of His time. After Jesus' resurrection, the early Church shifted the day of worship from Saturday to Sunday, the Lord's Day, because key events like the Resurrection happened on Sunday. So, Sunday became the day for worship and rest. The Catechism explains it this way: "On Sundays and other holy days of obligation, the faithful are to refrain from engaging in work or activities that hinder the worship owed to God, the joy proper to the Lord's Day, the performance of the works of mercy, and the appropriate relaxation of mind and body. Family needs or important social service can legitimately excuse from the obligation of Sunday rest. But the faithful should see to it that legitimate excuses do not lead to habits prejudicial to religion, family life, and health" (CCC# 2185). So, if your job or responsibilities are critical to the well-being of others like a nurse caring for hospital patients or a mom feeding her child, God understands; you're doing His work. Afterall, parents can't stop being parents just because it's a rest day, no matter how bad they'd like to. The Church doesn't expect you to quit your job if Sunday shifts are part of your reality. But ideally, we should aim for work schedules that allow us to keep Sunday special. Bottom line? If you're working on Sunday because you care for others or because that's the only employment available, that's not sinful. But if you're choosing unnecessary work that takes you away from God, family, and rest, that's something to seriously consider changing. God gives us six days for everything else, Sunday is His day. As Christians, we should always be striving to obtain employment that does not require Sunday work. In other words, it would only be sinful when or if we have made no effort to seek work that would allow us to be free on Sunday. Any kind of labor which can be done on another day of the week, and which might take us away from our focus on God, family, or charitable works is not good. Sunday is a day for Him, a holy and sacred day. Jesus gave His last breath of life so that we could have an opportunity to live, let us not live to work, but live for Him.
