DID YOU KNOW.....

Did you know the Church says you should love even those who owe you money?

Now that I have your attention. People often say things like, "I love those who show me love". But as Christians, we're called to something deeper. Jesus' command to "love your neighbor as yourself" (Matthew 22:39) is not just a moral suggestion but a binding command rooted in God's own law and nature. Jesus spoke these words as the eternal Son of God, with the same authority as the Father who gave the Ten Commandments on Sinai. We use the word *love* to describe many different things. We can love pizza, love our country, love our friends, and love our spouse. Obviously, those are not all the same kind of love. Pope Benedict XVI pointed out that the ancient Greeks had different words for different kinds of love. There was eros, referring to romantic love; philia, the love of friendship; and agape, a deeper, self-giving love that seeks the good of another. It is this "agape" love that stands at the heart of Christianity. When Jesus was asked about the greatest commandment, He answered that we must love God with our whole heart and love our neighbor as ourselves. The word used for that love is *agape*. This is not merely affection or friendship. It is a deliberate choice to seek the good of another person because God loves them. The beautiful thing about Christian love is that it is not limited by emotions. We can be kind to people we naturally like, but Jesus calls us even further. He says, "Love your enemies." That kind of love is impossible if love is only a feeling. But love is not just a feeling, it's an act of the will. Authentic Christian love means treating every person with dignity and compassion, even when we disagree with them, even when they hurt us, and even when loving them requires sacrifice. It is rooted in God's love, not in our emotions. One of the greatest misunderstandings in our culture is the idea that love means affirming everything someone does or believes. But Scripture teaches that genuine love always walks hand in hand with truth. St. Paul writes, "Speak the truth in love." Notice he doesn't tell us to choose one or the other. Christians are called to do both. Love without truth can become mere kind feelings with no real concern for a person's eternal welfare. On the other hand, truth without love can become harsh and uncharitable. If we truly care about someone, we want what is genuinely good for them not just what feels comfortable in the moment. Jesus taught that if a brother or sister falls into sin, we shouldn't ignore it. Instead, we should lovingly and gently help them find their way back to Him. St. Paul echoes this teaching when he encourages believers to restore those who have stumbled with a spirit of gentleness. This can be uncomfortable. Most of us would rather avoid difficult conversations. Yet authentic love is willing to take that risk when someone's relationship with God is at stake. Loving as Christ loves is not always easy. In fact, Jesus warned that following Him could sometimes bring opposition, misunderstanding, and even rejection. The world often measures love by how accepted or affirmed someone feels. Jesus measures love by faithfulness to God and a sincere desire for another person's ultimate good. Sometimes people may misunderstand our intentions when we speak the truth with charity. Yet Christ reminds us that if the world rejected Him, it should not surprise us when faithful disciples face the same challenge. At its heart, authentic Christian love is simple. As Pope Benedict XVI beautifully stated, "To love someone is to desire that person's good and to take effective steps to secure it." The greatest good we can desire for anyone is a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ. That means treating others with compassion, patience, mercy, and respect while never losing sight of the truth that sets us free. Christian love is not merely about making people feel good. It is about helping one another become holy, draw closer to God, and ultimately reach heaven. Want to know more about how to share the love of Christ with your neighbor? 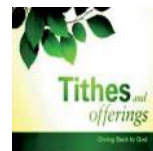

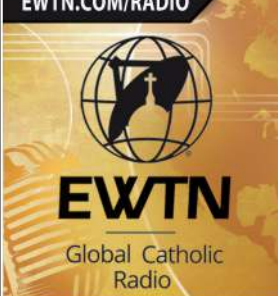
