DID YOU KNOW.....

Did you know the Church says it matters what others think about you?

Now that doesn't mean that everyone is going to like what you have to say or how you do things. But let's be real for a second, whether you realize it or not, you influence people every day. It could be your kids, your spouse, your coworkers, your friend, or even people who just watch how you live your life. And that influence matters more than we often think. In the Catholic tradition, Jesus' teaching on this matter is clear and serious. "If anyone causes one of these little ones, those who believe in me, to stumble, it would be better for them to have a large millstone hung around their neck and to be drowned in the depths of the sea. Woe to the world because of the things that cause people to stumble! Such things must come, but woe to the person through whom they come!" (Matthew 18:6-7) Let that sink in. So, being tied to a huge rock and drowned in the sea, is the better option? Wow! The "little ones" refers to believers, especially those who are new or vulnerable in their faith. The metaphor of the millstone and drowning in the sea underscores the irreversible harm such actions can cause. St. Paul's words in Romans 14:13 echo this: "Be careful, however, that the exercise of your rights does not become a stumbling block to the weak." There's a powerful, and honestly, sobering story in the Gospel about John the Baptist that illustrates this teaching. John spoke the truth to King Herod, calling him out for being in an unlawful relationship with his brother's wife, Herodias. Herodias grew angry, really angry. She held onto that resentment and eventually used her influence to get revenge. Through a series of events involving Herod and her daughter, she ultimately pushed John's execution. Think about that for a minute. Herodias didn't just sin in her own heart; she pulled others into it. She influenced her husband to make a terrible decision and her own daughter to ask for the death of an innocent man. That's the ripple effect of misplaced influence. And while most of us aren't in positions of power like a king or queen, we still have influence in quieter, everyday ways. Maybe you're a leader at work. Maybe you're a parent. Maybe you're just someone people look up to. The real question is, "what are you leading people toward?" Herodias showed her daughter that revenge and holding grudges mattered more than forgiveness or obedience to God. Herod showed that pride and pleasing others was more important than doing what's right. But John the Baptist showed that truth matters, even when it costs you everything. So, which one looks more like your life? Take a moment and think about this honestly, who is influenced by me? What do my actions teach them? Am I pointing them closer to Christ, or further away? Because at the end of the day, it's not just about what we say we believe, it's about how we live out our faith. None of us are perfect; we all mess up. But the goal is to live in a way that gently, and sometimes boldly, leads others toward truth, repentance, and ultimately toward God. Even when it's uncomfortable, unpopular, and even when it costs something. Are you modeling forgiveness, or holding onto grudges? Do you model integrity or show others that it's ok to lie? Is your Faith based on pleasing God or fear of what others think if you? God isn't asking for perfection, but He is calling for us to be His witness out in the world. Want to know more about how to be a witness for Christ? Start with something simple. Instead of gossiping about someone, try praising them in public. The next time you're at a restaurant, trying saying grace loud enough that others notice. When we live rooted in God's truth, our influence becomes not a huge millstone, but a light that guides others toward Him. Stay tuned next week when we talk about Guardian Angels.

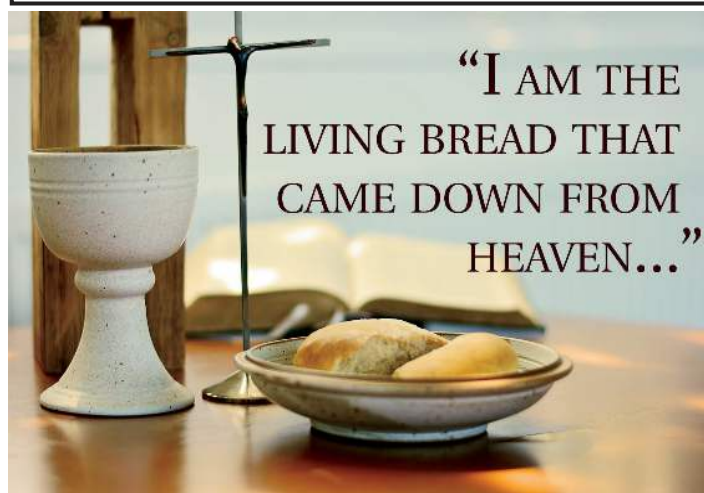
