DID YOU KNOW.....

Did you know the Church says that many of the saints we know and love today relished a good, happy hour?

Now I'm not claiming to be a saint, but just the other day, I was enjoying a cold beer at a family celebration when someone asked, "Deacon, are you allowed to drink?" Many people see Catholicism as traditional, and they're correct. But it's easy to think of "traditional" as being "stuffy," "boring," and "uptight." In other words, some might assume Catholics can't have fun, or can't enjoy alcohol. In reality, the exact opposite is true. The Church does teach that drunkenness is a form of gluttony, and a grave sin. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, "Alcohol consumption in moderation is not immoral. But we should avoid the abuse of alcohol just as we should avoid the abuse of any food, drug, or other substance. The virtue of temperance disposes us to avoid every kind of excess: the abuse of food, alcohol, tobacco, or medicine" (CCC 2290). However, that doesn't mean that Catholics can't drink at all; remember that Jesus' first miracle was to provide a super-abundance of the best wine for a group of wedding guests! In fact, wine is part of the most sacred moments in the Mass, the Eucharist, which tells us that alcohol itself isn't the problem. But drinking to the point where you lose control, make poor decisions, or harm yourself or others, that's where it becomes an issue. Just like excessive eating is gluttony, but we can still eat and enjoy good food. We are welcome to drink and appreciate alcohol, but not to the point where it becomes sinful. If your drinking starts to take over your behavior or cloud your judgment, then you can be assured that you have had a few too many. The Church draws a clear line between enjoying alcohol and misusing it. Having a drink with dinner or celebrating with friends? Totally fine. In other words, drunkenness, not drinking, is what the Church warns against. Catholic teaching places a big emphasis on self-control and virtue. Alcohol isn't bad, that's why moderation is key. Think of it this way, God gives us good things to enjoy, but He also asks us to use them wisely. Another important piece is how your actions affect other people. If your drinking causes harm, whether that's damaging relationships, setting a bad example, or leading someone else into trouble, then it's time to make a change. Sometimes, love means choosing not to drink at all in certain situations. Like if someone around you struggles with alcohol. Having a drink in front of them could lead them back into sin. It also might create confusion or scandal which can be sinful in itself. We're called to care for one another, so even something that's "allowed" can become wrong if it hurts someone else. At the end of the day, it's not just about "Can I drink?" but "What's the most loving and responsible choice I can make?" Bottom line, God made everything "good", and He wants us to enjoy what He made. But He also expects us to be good stewards of those creations. So, let love for God and neighbor, self-control and a well-formed conscience guide your choices. Want to know more about which saints enjoyed a nice "cold one"? Your local parish office is a great place to start asking. Stay tuned next week when we discuss what the Church says about abortion and euthanasia.

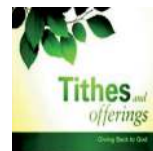
