DID YOU KNOW.....

Did you know the Church says the code to winning the LOTTO is found in your prayers?

Ok, hold on, don't double up on your Mega-Millions quick picks quite yet. I'm talking about the Heavenly LOTTO, not the Texas Lotto. Many of us pray daily, but how can we be certain whether our prayers are truly heard by God, and whether the responses we perceive are divine or influenced by other sources? Well first, God can answer prayers by saying no, or not yet.... no matter how bad we want Him to say, yes. That's because He will never lead us away from Himself; winning a truckload of money so we can "donate" it to the Church might sound like a great prayer, but Jesus knows us better. He will never issue an ultimatum, and He never contradicts the teachings of His Church. If a prayer draws you closer to God, inspires you to do His will, and serve His kingdom, you can rest assured it is from Him. Anything that leads away from these is likely rooted in personal desires or temptation. Prayer is a living encounter between God and the human heart, a divine gift and a human response. (Catechism §§2558–2649) It arises from humility and a longing that reflects Christ's own desire for us. God is always calling us into conversation; we just need to calm our hearts long enough to hear and answer the call. That's why Jesus teaches us to pray in solitude, from the heart, where God hears our true intentions and responds in love. Jesus models prayer through solitude, thanksgiving, intercession, and obedience; He gives us the path to shape our own prayer life. The Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary also guide and shape the Church's prayer life. The Holy Spirit intercedes perfectly on our behalf, even when our own words fall short. As Jesus said, "But I tell you the truth, it is better for you that I go. For if I do not go, the Advocate will not come to you. But if I go I will send him to you," affirming the Spirit's authority in our spiritual journey. (John 16:7) But what about going to Mary in prayer, aren't we supposed to go straight to God? St. Louis de Montfort says that we shouldn't think of ourselves as more special than Jesus: if Jesus came to us through Mary, we can confidently approach God through her intercession. Want to know more about the Heavenly LOTTO, prayer and how Mary and the other Saints intercede to God on our behalf? Contact your local parish office for more details. So, I was a little ambitious thinking I could cover prayer and regular fasting this week, so more on fasting next week.

An encyclical Letter of the Holy Father Francis

The Archdiocese of San Antonio has long endeavored to walk alongside the poor and most abandoned in our community. In response to an invitation from Pope Francis, the archdiocese has announced its commitment to join the international *Laudato Si'* Action Platform, which originates from the 2015 encyclical by the Holy Father on Care for Our Common Home.

A plan will be developed in a synodal style of discernment to address seven goals, which include: Response to the Cry of the Earth, Response to the Cry of the Poor, Ecological Economics, Adoption of Sustainable Lifestyles, Ecological Education, Ecological Spirituality, and Community Resilience and Empowerment. “Everyone’s talents and involvement are needed,” the pontiff stated in *Laudato Si'*.

“I invite all the People of God in the archdiocese to join me in reflecting on how we hear and respond to the Cry of the Poor and the Cry of the Earth,” stated Archbishop Gustavo García-Siller, MSPS. “Together, let us proceed in faith toward the fulfillment of God’s divine plan for us and for all Creation.”

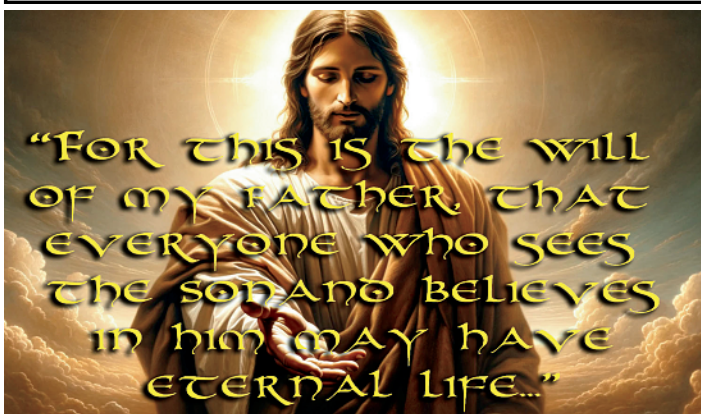
RELIGIOUS EDUCATION AND YOUTH MINISTRY SERVICE PROJECT

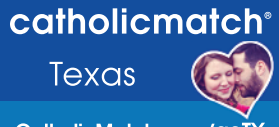
